## IMPACT REPORT 2022

Whether you gave \$20 or \$20,000 to Project Transitions last year, you helped your neighbors with HIV get back on their feet. Thank you!

You were part of a compassionate community that provided housing, food, individual support, and a critical connection to HIV treatment to people in need. Your generosity helped 54 people avoid or transition out of homelessness, recover their health and stabilize their lives.

And critically — you helped prevent new HIV infections in Central Texas. We know that the only source of new HIV infections is people who are untreated — which means the only way to stop new infections is to connect people to treatment.

Over the past five years, 80% of our clients were out of care upon admission to our programs. Today and every day, 100% of our residents are treating their HIV — and aren't discharged until they're ready to maintain their treatment on their own.

This is why your generosity matters so much: because there's no other way that we will end the HIV epidemic. You didn't just help people with HIV change their lives. You improved their health, lowered their HIV viral load, and got us that much closer to a world without AIDS. ♥



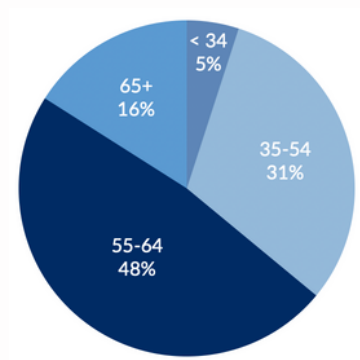
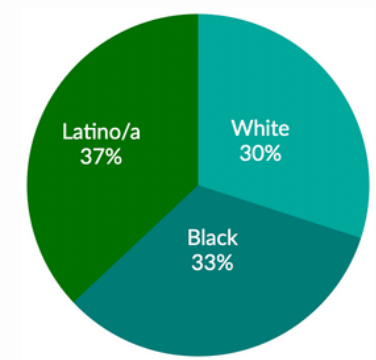
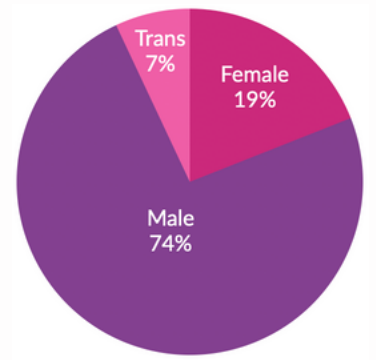
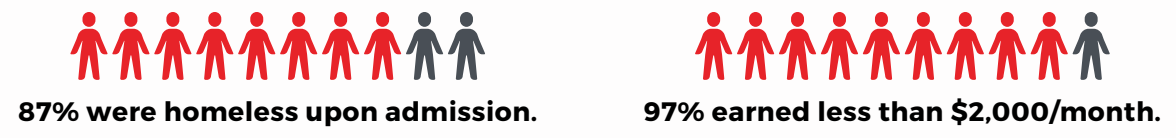

# WHO NEEDS PT?

A closer look at the people who needed our help in 2022.



## WHY IT MATTERS: HIV STILL SPREADING IN CENTRAL TEXAS

- 10 years of local data shows we haven't stopped or slowed new infections.
- Only 56% of people w/HIV in Austin are virally suppressed and can no longer transmit HIV to others.\*
- Young people are still being infected: people younger than 34 make up 69% of new infections.
- We serve more people who are older than 65 each year. They will need ongoing support as they age.

The COVID pandemic required significant changes to our day-to-day programs to protect the health of our clients. We finally started getting back to normal in 2022.

- ✓ **54 PEOPLE WITH HIV** called PT home in 2022, with 15 partners and family members, for a total of 69 people served.
- **SUPPORTIVE HOUSING** served 53 people: 38 with HIV and their families
- **DOUG'S HOUSE** cared for 16 people: 2 in hospice care, 14 in recuperative care

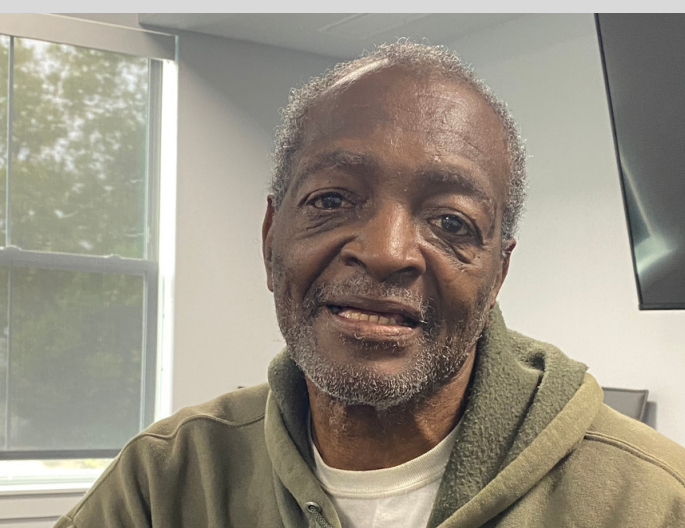
# NEW HOUSING WILL SERVE AUSTIN FOR GENERATIONS TO COME



2022 was a milestone year: We completed and opened the 40-unit Roosevelt Gardens supportive housing facility. That increased Austin's housing capacity for people living with HIV for the first time since 1998!

And we're just getting started: this year, we'll begin construction on Burnet Place, with 61 units of housing. We're in the final stages of the **HIV: Housing Is Vital Capital Campaign**, co-chaired by Lew Aldridge and Charlotte Hale, which is making this bold vision a reality.
